

Costs and booking

Charges for Easter Settlement include accommodation with full board from Friday evening meal until Monday after lunch (3 nights) or Tuesday breakfast (4 nights). A subsidy from Quaker Outreach in Yorkshire (QOY) reduces costs for children and young people and covers the expenses of facilitators. QOY welcomes donations towards its work.

What is Easter Settlement?

Easter Settlement provides an opportunity for us to strengthen our spiritual base, as part of a wider Quaker family. The weekend programme is a mixture of reflection, discussion, worship and fun. Dancing, crafts, walking and singing together are also ingredients of the gathering. Single people and families, those new to the Society of Friends and established Settlers are all made welcome.

What is Easter Settlement about?

We will explore the Quaker testimony to Simplicity, and seek ways to witness to this testimony in our everyday lives. Our keynote speaker, Jennifer Kavanagh came to Friends in 1996 and worked for Quaker Social Action. She contributed to most of the series of booklets *Twelve Quakers and...*, and edited the collection, *New Light: Twelve Quaker Voices*. Her own writing includes *Call of the Bell Bird*, *The World is our Cloister*, *The O of Home* and *Simplicity Made Easy*. She is an associate tutor at Woodbrooke Quaker Study Centre.

We will also be seeking contributions from Settlers who may wish to share their own experiences of attempting to live simply. There will be small group and informal discussions in which everyone will have the chance to share. Children (under 11) and young people (11-16) will enjoy separate sessions which reflect the theme of our Settlement and they will participate in home groups and other activities with the adults.

What else happens at Easter Settlement?

A typical day at Easter Settlement includes sessions or workshops in the mornings and early evenings. In the afternoons free time gives the chance to explore the area, independently or on guided walks, to share skills and interests, to continue discussions or to relax, read or

sleep. After the evening meal we have social time and a variety of activities will be on offer. There are also poetry reading groups, hymn singing, an Easter Egg Hunt, and Settlers may be able to organise a Meeting for Worship at Fylingdales.

The Venue

Cober Hill Guesthouse is set in gardens half a mile from the beach and the Cleveland Way cliff path. It is close to the village of Cloughton, about five miles north of Scarborough on the Whitby road. N^o 93 Whitby bus from Scarborough Railway Station stops at the Red Lion, just outside the gate. There is ample car parking space. Travel details will be sent with confirmation of booking.
